### REQUIREMENTS :

Class 1F License with airbrake endorsement.

Comfortable with smartphone technology.

Ability to wear all standard PPE (safety boots, CSA approved hard hat, safety vest, etc.)

Ability to secure cargo using straps, load bars, etc.

Dangerous Goods certification preferred. (FAST Card required to transport Dangerous Goods or Hazmat in USA).

Cross-border drivers require a valid passport, a clean criminal record check, and test negative on pre-employment drug and alcohol testing. FAST Card Preferred.

### QUALIFICATIONS:

- Patient and professional demeanour.
- Ability to work independently.
- Effective time management skills.
- Comfortable being away from home for extended periods of time.
- Written and verbal communication abilities.
- Ability to maneuver 50-100 lbs. depending on load.
- Reefer and heater knowledge is an asset.
- Clean driving record.
- Ability to adapt to changing conditions, troubleshoot equipment and find new routes when needed.

### JOB OVERVIEW

As a Longhaul Driver, you may be away from home for 1-3 weeks at a time, moving freight from one location to another. Depending on company operations, scheduling and customer service requirements you may drive as a single driver or as a team driver. You will spend the majority of your time driving between locations. You will be responsible for transporting freight, ensuring secure loading and unloading of cargo, and adhering to all transportation regulations. Based on company specialization you may pull various types of cargo vans such as “dry van, heater van or reefer van”. Generally, drivers who cross the border to the United States receive higher pay than Canada-only drivers.

### RESPONSIBILITIES

- Accountable for the safe transport of freight between pickup location and drop off location, loading freight, securing freight, and unloading freight.
- Secure and transport freight according to NSC Standard 10 Cargo Securement.
- Knowledgeable in the areas of operation, following all applicable traffic laws, and driving according to road conditions.
- Drive in all weather conditions and climates, including night-time.
- Inspect the tractor, trailer, and freight before, during and after the trip, recording and correcting any defects. (Example; Record pre-trip and post-trip inspections on driver daily vehicle inspection report ‘DVIR’).
- Use Electronic Logging Device to record driving time, on-duty not driving, off-duty, and sleeper berth hours, etc., complying with all hours-of-service regulations.
- Report any delays/incidents encountered to Dispatch.
- Ensure all required documentation relating to the cargo is completed and handled properly.
- Follow all policies and procedures set forth by ABC company.
