REQUIREMENTS :

Class 1F License with airbrake endorsement.

Comfortable with smartphone technology.

Ability to wear all standard PPE (safety boots, CSA approved hard hat, safety vest, etc.)

Ability to secure cargo using straps, load bars, etc.

Third-Party Dangerous Goods certification is preferred.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Patient and professional demeanour.
- Effective time management skills.
- Ability to work independently.
- Written and verbal communication abilities.
- Comfortable being away from home for 1-3 days.
- Ability to maneuver 50-100 lbs., depending on load.
- Clean driving record.
- Ability to adapt to changing conditions, troubleshoot equipment and find new routes when needed.

JOB OVERVIEW

As a short-haul Driver, you will be responsible for transporting freight, ensuring secure loading and unloading of cargo, and adhering to all transportation regulations. Short-haul drivers are also categorized as Regional, Local or City. Local and/or City Drivers are home every night. Most of the day is spent loading or unloading with the balance of the time driving. Regional Drivers spend most of their time driving and return home after 1-3 days on the road. Short-haul drivers may make several deliveries and pickups in a single day or over several days.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Accountable for the safe transport of freight between pickup location and drop off location, loading freight, securing freight, and unloading freight.
- Secure and transport freight according to NSC Standard 10 Cargo Securement.
- Knowledgeable in the areas of operation, following all applicable traffic laws, and driving according to road conditions.
- Drive in all weather conditions and climates, including night-time.
- Inspect the tractor, trailer, and freight before, during and after the trip, recording and correcting any defects. (Example; Record pre-trip and post-trip inspections on driver daily vehicle inspection report 'DVIR').
- Use Electronic Logging Device to record driving time, on-duty not driving, off-duty, and sleeper berth hours, etc., complying with all hours-of-service regulations.
- Report any delays/incidents encountered to Dispatch.
- Ensure all required documentation relating to the cargo is completed and handled properly.
- Follow all policies and procedures set forth by ABC company.
- Cross-border drivers require a valid passport, a clean criminal record check, and test negative on pre-employment drug and alcohol testing. FAST Card preferred.
