REQUIREMENTS:

JOB OVERVIEW

As a Transport Trailer technician, your primary responsibility is to diagnose, assemble, repair, and maintain transport trailers used to carry commercial or non-commercial goods. You will work on all parts and systems of a transport trailer including framework, body work, suspension, brakes, wheels, electrical, hydraulic and refrigeration. You will use your mechanical, electrical, and hydraulic systems expertise to troubleshoot issues and perform necessary repairs to ensure optimal functionality. Additionally, your role may involve conducting routine inspections, adhering to safety protocols, and efficiently managing repair tasks to minimize downtime.

Specializations of this trade includes servicing trailers used in construction, over dimensional, vehicle hauling, liquid tanks, and pneumatic tanks, etc.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Inspect and test trailers for proper performance.
- Diagnose and repair trailers, ensuring safe operational functions.
- Maintain trailers, conducting regular preventative maintenance and routine checks and adjustments to fluid levels, hoses, brakes, belts, etc.
- Perform safety inspections, documenting all defects, malfunctions, and when applicable, complete Periodic Mandatory Vehicle Inspection (PMVI) form.
- Source parts and supplies when necessary.
- All work must be completed within the company's safety guidelines.
- Complete appropriate documentation.
- Report and document any incidents encountered.
- Follow all policies and procedures set forth by ABC company.
